18		from back when I worked for Monumental, so I
19		did some checking and I was right.

21		a Mrs. Baldwin Jeffords eight and a half
22		years ago. Somehow that Mrs. Jeffords
23		managed to pull a radio into the bathtub and
24		electrocute herself.
25	JOHNNY	Radios don't make the best tub toys. Three
26		accidents - three dead wives. It does have
27		an aroma.
28	LEE	${\tt I'm}$ going to put a hold on paying this claim
29		for now, Johnny. I want you to head on down
30		to Mississippi and see what you can find
31		out.

1	JOHNNY	Expense account item number two - a hundred
2		twenty four dollars and fifty cents - air
3		fare to Biloxi, where I rented a car
4		item three - twenty five dollars and
5		drove seventy miles or so to Jolene, a tiny
6		backwater that seemed out of place in the
7		twentieth century. If I didn't know any
8		better, I'd say they only just removed the
9		hitching posts on Main Street last week.
10		Come to think of it, I don't know any
11		better. (CONTINUES)

13	ETTA	Do you have any reason to believe that it
14		wasn't an accident, Mr. Dollar?
15	JOHNNY	Only the coincidence. And a suspicious
16		mind. I was hoping that a look through your
17		newspaper archive and a chat with the
18		Sheriff here might shed some light on the
19		matter.

11		expensive TLC, you know.
12	JOHNNY	Jeffords doesn't sound like a man who's hard
13		up for cash.
14	ETTA	I wouldn't think so. His family has
15		practically owned this whole county for
16		about as long as anyone can remember.
17	JOHNNY	Well, that knocks out one of the most likely
18		motives in a double indemnity case.
19	ETTA	I can't say anything about motive, Mr.
20		Dollar, but I've had my own suspicions about
21		Baldwin Jeffords for a long time.
22	JOHNNY	Suspicions?
23	ETTA	His first wife died under unusual
24		circumstances.
25	JOHNNY	Yes, that was one of the things I wanted to
26		look up in your archive.
27	ETTA	Molly Jeffords taught at the high school
28		here in Jolene. She was the advisor for the
29		school paper. She encouraged me to go to
30		college and study journalism.
31	JOHNNY	I see.

1	ETTA	She was one of my favorite teachers, Mr.
2		Dollar and she was a friend. I don't
3		believe she accidentally pulled a radio into
4		the bathtub. She didn't even like radio.
5	JOHNNY	(FADING) Well, let's have a look at those
6		back issues.
7	ETTA	(FADING) They're over here.
8	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) The back issues of the
9		newspaper weren't a lot of help. There was
10		a pattern of sorts. The Coroner and Sheriff
11		investigated all three deaths - if you can
12		call what they did investigating - and all
13		three were ruled accidents. Other than my

2	CORONER	Don't believe I've had the pleasure, Mister-
3	JOHNNY	Dollar. I'm an insurance investigator, Dr.
4		Woodford, looking into the death of Mrs.
5		Baldwin Jeffords.
6	CORONER	Oh, yes. Missy Jeffords. Nasty business.
7		She fell out of a loft onto a harrow. Cut
8		her up pretty bad. At least it was quick.
9	JOHNNY	Did you conduct a formal inquest?
10	CORONER	No need for that, Mr. Dollar. The body was
11		found just below the loft. Part of the rail
12		had come loose and was laying on the floor
13		beside her. It was pretty obvious what had
14		happened.
15	JOHNNY	Did the railing break?
16	CORONER	No, it looked like some nails had worked
17		loose. If she slipped and fell against it -
18		it wouldn't have taken much.
19	JOHNNY	You don't think it had been tampered with?
20	CORONER	No, sir. Not me. About the only thing
21		unusual about it at all was the way she was
22		dressed.
23	JOHNNY	Oh, how was that?
24	CORONER	Well, seeing as she was in the barn I would
25		have expected her to be wearing riding
26		clothes or maybe dungarees.
27	JOHNNY	But she wasn't?
28	CORONER	No, she was dressed up like she was planning
29		on going into town - a nice dress, some
30		jewelry, perfume.
31	JOHNNY	That doesn't sound like she intended to be
32		working in the barn.

1	CORONER	No, sir, it sure doesn't. It's pretty
2		evident what killed her but I have no idea
3		what she was doing up in the loft dressed
4		like that. I don't reckon we'll never know.
5	MUSIC	BRIDGE
6	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) I had almost decided to wrap it
7		up and go home. Cars crash, accidents
8		happen. What was it the Sheriff said? If
9		Doc Woodford calls it an accident, it's an
10		accident. But the doctor had some doubts.
11		I don't think he even realized he had them
12		but he had them. It wasn't much to go on
13		but Melissa Jeffords wasn't dressed
14		correctly to be in that loft. I decided it
15		was at least worth a conversation with her
16		husband. I drove out to the Jeffords Estate
17		and found myself in front of an impressive
18		antebellum mansion. (CONTINUES)
19	SFX	DOOR KNOCK - DOOR OPENS
20	JOHNNY	I was a little surprised when a smartly
21		dressed, gray haired woman answered the
22		door.
23	ANNABELLE	Yes?
24	JOHNNY	Good Afternoon, ma'am. My name is Johnny
25		Dollar. I was hoping to have a few words
26		with Mr. Jeffords. Is he in?
27	ANNABELLE	May I ask what it's about?
28	JOHNNY	I'm here on behalf of Federated Life. It's
29		in regard to his recent loss.
30	ANNABELLE	Oh - well yes of course. Do come in,
31		please. Let's step into the parlor here.
32	JOHNNY	Thank you.

1	ANNABELLE	Have a chair, Mr. Dollar. Make yourself
2		comfortable. I'm Annabelle Jeffords
3		Baldwin's mother. I'm afraid he's not here
4		at the moment.
5	JOHNNY	Oh. Well-
6	ANNABELLE	He told me he was going to the factory but ${\tt I}$
7		saw him picking flowers before he left. I'm
8		pretty sure he was going to the cemetery.
9	JOHNNY	Well, I certainly wouldn't want to intrude
10		on that.
11	ANNABELLE	He's been out there every day since - well,
12		it was a truly horrible accident. Melissa
13		was such a lovely girl. It was a closed
14		casket funeral, you know.
15	JOHNNY	No, I didn't. I'm sorry to hear that.
16	ANNABELLE	Such a shame.
17	JOHNNY	Mrs. Jeffords, can you tell me anything
18		about the circumstances of the accident that
19		killed her?
20	ANNABELLE	Circumstances? Why, what do you mean? She
21		fell from the loft but nobody saw it
22		actually happen.
23	JOHNNY	No, of course not, but as I understand it,
24		the accident happened sometime around mid-
25		day. Do you know, did anyone see her or
26		speak to her before that?
27	ANNABELLE	She and Baldwin had breakfast together that
28		morning but then he went to the factory. I
29		was - indisposed - I didn't see her at all
30		that day until (PAUSE)
31	JOHNNY	Who discovered the body?

1	ANNABELLE	One of the grooms found her - Henry
2		Metcalfe. It was just terrible. He was
3		really shaken by it.
4	JOHNNY	Do you think I could speak with him?
5	ANNABELLE	I suppose you could but I believe he went
6		into town this morning Mr. Dollar, why
7		are you asking all these questions?
8	JOHNNY	It's my job, ma'am. I'm an investigator.
9	ANNABELLE	Investigator? Mercy! Just what in the
10		world do you think you're investigating?
11	JOHNNY	It's purely routine. But I'm sure you know
12		this is the second accidental death claim
13		your son has made in a relatively short
14		time. Under the circumstances it's company
15		policy to conduct an investigation.
16	ANNABELLE	Well, I can assure you there is nothing to
17		investigate. No one had any reason to want
18		to harm Melissa, certainly not Baldwin. He
19		was hopelessly in love with her.
20	JOHNNY	I'm sure I can wrap this up pretty quickly.
21		I just need to do a few interviews and it
22		would help if I could have a look at the
23		scene of the accident - enough to file a
24		report. If you wouldn't mind showing me
25		where it happened
26	ANNABELLE	(FADING) Very well, Mr. Dollar. Come with
27		me. I'll take you to the barn.
28		

1	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) I didn't learn much from the
2		accident scene. The loft railing had
3		already been replaced with a sturdy new
4		one. Two weeks after the fact, I knew the
5		chances of my finding any new physical
6		evidence were mighty slim. That made the
7		interviews more important than ever. I had
8		returned to my hotel and was about to call
9		the factory to see if Baldwin had actually
10		gone there when-
11	SFX	TELEPHONE RING - PICKUP
12	JOHNNY	Johnny Dollar.
13	ETTA (FILTER)	Mr. Dollar, this is Etta Stone.
14	JOHNNY	(PLEASED) Miss Stone! How did you know I
15		was staying at the Magnolia?
16	ETTA (FILTER)	I'm a reporter, remember? And a pretty fair
17		detective, myself. Besides, the Magnolia is
18		the only hotel in town. Where else would
19		you stay?
20	JOHNNY	You have clearly mastered the art of
21		deductive reasoning, Miss Stone.
22	ETTA (FILTER)	Oh, Miss Stone sounds so formal. Please,
23		call me Etta.
24	JOHNNY	Alright, then, and I'm Johnny. What can I
25		do for you, Etta?
26	ETTA (FILTER)	Could we possibly meet, somewhere? I have
27		some information that I think may be useful
28		to your investigation.
29	JOHNNY	Did we miss something in the archives?
30	ETTA (FILTER)	No, this is new and it puts Melissa
31		Jeffords' accident in a whole different
32		light.

1	JOHNNY	Well, do you know of a place with decent
2		food and a little privacy? I'd love to buy
3		you dinner.
4	ETTA (FILTER)	How about Doodles'? It's a little roadhouse
5		out on Parker's Mill Road near the county
6		line. The food is nothing special but it's
7		a good place to meet someone if you want to
8		avoid prying eyes. It gets a little rowdy
9		on weekends but through the week there's not
10		much of a crowd.
11	JOHNNY	That sounds good. Shall I pick you up?
12	ETTA (FILTER)	No. I'll meet you there in, say forty-five
13		minutes?
14	JOHNNY	Alright, it's a date.
15	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) Doodles' was a quiet place.
16		Two men in overalls sat at the bar drinking
17		beer and there was a young couple on the
18		other side of the dining room. They were
19		focused on each other so we pretty much had
20		the place to ourselves. Etta was busting to
21		tell me about her "scoop".
22	ETTA	I had a call this afternoon, Johnny. This
23		is a small town and news travels fast. Your
24		looking into the accident The call was
25		from - well, she asked me not to use her
26		name, but she was a close friend of Melissa
27		Jeffords.
28	JOHNNY	(SMILE) An unnamed source?
29	ETTA	A <u>reliable</u> source.
30	JOHNNY	So, what did your source have to say?
31	ETTA	Melissa Jeffords was getting ready to file
32		for a divorce.

1	JOHNNY	Are you sure of that?
2	ETTA	On the day she died she had an appointment
3		with a lawyer over in Pendleton. She was
4		going to sign the papers that very
5		afternoon.
6	JOHNNY	The friend told you this?
7	ETTA	She gave me the name of the attorney, too -
8		Owen Webster. I called him to confirm what
9		she said.
10	JOHNNY	And?
11	ETTA	He declined comment attorney-client
12		privilege. Johnny, I'd bet you a hundred
13		dollars what she says is true.
14	JOHNNY	That's not the picture Annabelle Jeffords
15		painted for me. She said they were madly in
16		love - that Baldwin goes to the cemetery
17		every day.
18	ETTA	What would you expect her to say? That they
19		argued constantly? That she and Melissa
20		didn't get along?
21	JOHNNY	What else can you tell me about the family?
22		

1	ETTA	Well, as I said before, the Jeffords have
2		been around here running things for as long
3		as anyone can remember. Baldwin's father
4		nearly lost everything when the market
5		crashed in twenty-nine. There were rumors
6		that he killed himself but it was all hushed
7		up. Somehow Annabelle managed to keep the
8		factory going until the war came along.
9		That's about the time Baldwin took over.
10		During the war, they converted over and got
11		a big contract making coffins for the Army.
12		A lot of our own local boys came home in
13		those coffins but the war was very good to
14		the Jeffords. (CONTINUES)
15	SFX	FOOTSTEPS APPROACHING
16	ETTA	Uh, oh. Don't look now but we've got
17		company.
18	SHERIFF	Mr. Dollar, I thought I made myself clear to
19		you this morning.
20	JOHNNY	What are you talking about, Sheriff?
21	SHERIFF	You've been out to the Jeffords place making
22		all kinds of wild accusations and threats.
23	JOHNNY	Who told you that?
24	SHERIFF	Never you mind about that. I warned you not
25		to be harassing the Jeffords and you didn't
26		listen. I think it's about time you pack up
27		your carpet bag and head on back to
28		Connecticut.
29	JOHNNY	Are you riding me out of town on a rail,
30		Sheriff?
31	SHERIFF	If that's what it takes.

1	JOHNNY	Fine. I have all I need anyway. I'll just
2		report that I wasn't able to finish my
3		investigation but that there's sufficient
4		evidence to deny the claim.
5	SHERIFF	What are you talking about?
6	JOHNNY	This whole situation stinks and if you were
7		any kind of real lawman, you'd know it.
8	SHERIFF	Now, you listen here
9	JOHNNY	No, you listen, Sheriff. If Baldwin
10		Jeffords wants that insurance money, he's
11		going to have to sue for it and Federated
12		has an army of lawyers. He may win
13		eventually but it'll cost him thousands of
14		dollars and take years.
15	SHERIFF	Why, you low down-
16	JOHNNY	And, of course, in a civil suit we can $\underline{\text{make}}$
17		him testify.
18	SHERIFF	(CHOKED COUGH)
19	JOHNNY	I'm going to get to the truth one way or
20		another, Sheriff, sooner or later. And
21		later is just fine with me. Rest assured,
22		though, I'll make it a point to let Mr.
23		Jeffords know exactly $\underline{\text{why}}$ the claim is being
24		delayed.
25	SHERIFF	(EXASPERATED) Alright, alright! Finish
26		your blasted investigation if it will make
27		you happy. But make it quick, you hear me?
28	JOHNNY	Sooner is fine, too, Sheriff. And the
29		sooner the better.
30	MUSIC	BRIDGE

1	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) I figured it was about time I
2		had that conversation with Baldwin Jeffords
3		so I drove back out to the estate. This
4		time I called ahead to make sure that he
5		would be home.
6	BALDWIN	I don't understand, Mr. Dollar
7	JOHNNY	Not to put too fine a point on it, Mr.
8		Jeffords, but two double indemnity claims in
9		six years looks a little suspicious. Three
10		of them in nine years, even more so.
11	BALDWIN	Just what are you getting at?
12	JOHNNY	I think it's possible that your wife was
13		murdered.
14	BALDWIN	And you think I did it?
15	ANNABELLE	This is outrageous!
16	JOHNNY	You wouldn't be the first husband to profit
17		from his wife's death. You're the logical
18		choice.
19	BALDWIN	Mr. Dollar, I loved my wife. I've loved all
20		of them. It just seems that I'm not meant
21		to have any lasting happiness.
22	JOHNNY	You're saying your marriage was a happy one?
23	BALDWIN	Of course it was.
24	JOHNNY	Lying to me doesn't help your credibility,
25		Mr. Jeffords.
26	BALDWIN	I don't know what you've heard or where you
27		may have heard it, Mr. Dollar, but I assure
28		you I am not lying. It's true, Melissa and I
29		were going through a rough patch but we were
30		working it out.
31	JOHNNY	Did you know your wife was getting ready to
32		file for a divorce?

1	BALDWIN	That's a lie!
2	JOHNNY	It's a fact.
3	ANNABELLE	Who told you that?
4	JOHNNY	She had a meeting with a lawyer the
5		afternoon she was killed. That's why she
6		was dressed up. Your Coroner noticed it but
7		he had no reason to think it might be
8		significant.
9	BALDWIN	Doc Woodford said it was an accident.
10	JOHNNY	And Sheriff Hardin took a pass on making any
11		real investigation. Or was he was just
12		deferring to a - benefactor? I've seen the
13		reports he made in all three investigations.
14		None got more than token scrutiny.
15	BALDWIN	Mr. Dollar, if anything sinister happened in
16		any of those cases, I'd want to know about
17		it. Do you honestly think the Sheriff
18		looked the other way because he thought $\underline{\mathtt{I}}$
19		might be involved?
20	JOHNNY	Look at it from where ${\tt I'm}$ standing. What do
21		you think?
22	SFX	TELEPHONE PICKUP - DIALING
23	BALDWIN	Well, let me put your concerns to rest. I
24		loved my wives and if anybody Hello,
25		Sheriff Hardin?
26	ANNABELLE	What are you doing, dear?
27		

1	BALDWIN	I've got a Mr. Dollar here from the
2		insurance company. (PAUSE) No, he's not
3		harassing me. But he seems to think you've
4		done a poor job of investigating Melissa's
5		death - and Amy's and Molly's as well.
6		Estill, if you've ever held back because you
7		thought I was involved - well, if you have,
8		you've done me a great disservice.
9	ANNABELLE	Baldwin-
10	BALDWIN	It may be too late to make any difference
11		but I'd consider it a personal favor if you
12		would re-open <u>all</u> of those cases. (PAUSE)
13		Yes, I'm completely serious. Thanks,
14		Estill.
15	SFX	TELEPHONE HANG-UP
16	BALDWIN	There, Mr. Dollar. Satisfied?
17	JOHNNY	(SIGHS)
18	ANNABELLE	Baldwin, you didn't have to do that. Are
19		you out of your mind?
20	BALDWIN	Don't be silly, mother. I have nothing to
21		hide. I want the truth as much as Mr.
22		Dollar does - maybe even more.
23	MUSIC	BRIDGE

1	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) It was quite an act, calling the
2		Sheriff, asking him to reopen the
3		investigations. Or was it? I still liked
4		Baldwin Jeffords for the murder but I just
5		wasn't sure. I needed to think about it so
6		I drove out to Doodle's for a cold beer -
7		that's expense account item fourteen, half a
8		buck. I was still nursing it when a man in
9		overalls and a plaid shirt walked up
10		(CONTINUES)
11	SFX	CHAIR SCRAPE
12	JOHNNY	pulled out a chair and sat down across the
13		table from me. He sat there for a moment,
14		expressionless. I stared back.
15	JOHNNY	(IN CHARACTER) Won't you join me? Have a
16		seat. (PAUSE) What can I do for you, Mr. ?
17	HENRY	The question is, what can I do for you?
18	JOHNNY	Okay. I'm listening.
19	HENRY	I saw you out at the Jeffords place earlier.
20		You want to know what really happened to Miz
21		Jeffords, is that right?
22	JOHNNY	That's right.
23	HENRY	You work for the insurance company.
24	JOHNNY	I do.
25	HENRY	If Miz Jeffords didn't die by accident, the
26		insurance company would stand to save some
27		real dough, wouldn't it.
28	JOHNNY	That's why I'm here.
29	HENRY	So, if there was say an eyewitness
30		would there be any kind of reward?

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1	JOHNNY	Well, you have to realize that an
2		uncorroborated eyewitness who stands to gain
3		from his testimony isn't much use in court.
4	HENRY	I can't help it if I'm the only one who was
5		there besides Miz Jeffords and the killer.
6	JOHNNY	Killer?
7	HENRY	She was pushed.
8	JOHNNY	By who?
9	HENRY	That information will cost you.
10	JOHNNY	You'd have to be willing to swear an
11		affidavit. And you might have to testify in
12		court eventually, too.
13	HENRY	How much?
14	JOHNNY	I'd have to check with the home office.
15		Maybe a few hundred.
16	HENRY	A grand.
17	JOHNNY	That's a lot of money.
18	HENRY	How much are they paying you?
19	JOHNNY	Look, I can give you a coupla hundred on my
20		own authority. A thousand bucks - I'll have
21		to get it approved. Where can I reach you?
22	SFX	CHAIR SCRAPE
23	HENRY	Don't worry about it. I'll get back in
24		touch with you, assuming I don't get a
25		better offer first.
26	JOHNNY	That's a dangerous game, mister.
27	HENRY	These are dangerous times.
28	JOHNNY	At least take my card. I'm staying at The
29		Magnolia.
30	HENRY	Of course you are, Mr. Dollar. Where else
31		would you stay?
32	MUSIC	BRIDGE

1	JOHNNY	I placed a call back to Hartford first thing
2		the next morning. You were in a meeting so
3		I left a message and went out to have
4		breakfast, that's expense account item
5		seventeen, a buck and a half. Then I went
6		back to my room to wait for your return
7		call. It must have been a long meeting. It
8		was almost lunchtime
9	SFX	TELEPHONE RINGS - PICKUP
10		

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1	JOHNNY	Johnny Dollar.
2	ETTA (FILTER)	Johnny, I've got another scoop for you and
3		this could be really big.
4	JOHNNY	What is it?
5	ETTA FILTER)	I've just learned the Sheriff is at the
6		Jeffords estate right now. There's been
7		another accidental death.
8	JOHNNY	Do you know who it was?
9	ETTA (FILTER)	I don't have confirmation yet but I think it
10		was one of the farm hands, a man named Henry
11		Metcalfe.
12	JOHNNY	The man who discovered Melissa Jeffords'
13		body.
14	ETTA (FILTER)	That's right.
15	SFX	DOOR KNOCK
16	JOHNNY	Can you hold on just a second? There's
17		somebody at the door.
18	SFX	DOOR KNOCK - INSISTENT
19	SHERIFF	(OFF) Mr. Dollar?
20	ETTA (FILTER)	I need to get out to the Jeffords estate.
21	JOHNNY	To interview the Sheriff?
22	ETTA (FILTER)	Among other things, yes.
23	SHERIFF	(OFF) Mr. Dollar?
24	SFX	DOOR KNOCKING
25	JOHNNY	You won't find him there, Etta.
26	SFX	DOOR OPENS
27	ETTA (FILTER)	What do you mean? Why not?
28	JOHNNY	Because he's right here. Hello, Sheriff.
29	ETTA (FILTER)	I'm coming over.
30	SFX	CLICK - HANG UP PHONE
31	JOHNNY	Sheriff Hardin. What can I do for you?
32	SHERIFF	Do you recognize this, Mr. Dollar?

1	JOHNNY	My business card. It's a little soggy.
2	SHERIFF	Yes. It was floating in a pond.
3	JOHNNY	Floating?
4	SHERIFF	In the pocket of a man named Henry Metcalfe.
5		Henry was a groom out at the Jeffords'
6		place. Miz Jeffords found him floating face
7		down in the pond early this morning.
8	JOHNNY	Five foot nine, sandy hair, freckles?
9	SHERIFF	That's him. How did you happen to know him?
10	JOHNNY	I met him last night. We had a beer
11		together at Doodles'.
12	SHERIFF	You just may have been the last person to
13		see him alive, then, Mr. Dollar.
14	JOHNNY	I doubt it, Sheriff. You don't really think
15		this was an accident?
16	SHERIFF	Doc Woodford is still examining the body
17		but, yeah, it looks like it was.
18	JOHNNY	That wasn't a chance meeting we had last
19		night, Sheriff. Metcalfe offered to sell me
20		information about Melissa Jeffords' death.
21	SHERIFF	Information? What did he say?
22	JOHNNY	That it was no accident. He saw her pushed
23		from that loft.
24	SHERIFF	Pushed?
25	JOHNNY	He was an eyewitness.
26	SHERIFF	Well, who pushed her, then?
27	JOHNNY	He didn't say. We hadn't come to terms. I
28		was waiting for a call back to okay the
29		money.
30	SHERIFF	Won't do us any good now.

1	JOHNNY	No, but it ought to be enough to convince
2		you to re-open the investigation into
3		Melissa Jeffords' death.
4	SHERIFF	I already did. Baldwin called me last night
5		and asked me to. I was going to start going
6		over everything again this morning but then
7		I got the call about Metcalfe.
8	SFX	TELEPHONE RING
9	JOHNNY	That's probably Hartford now.
10	SHERIFF	(FADING) Take your call, Dollar. I'm going
11		back to my office to think.
12	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) One thing was certain: Melissa
13		Jeffords' death was no accident. I suppose
14		that, technically speaking, my job was
15		already done. There was enough evidence to
16		stand up at trial if Federated denied the
17		double indemnity. But finding the killer
18		would be a much better way to close the
19		case. I was wondering how to do that when I
20		got another call from the Sheriff inviting
21		me over to his office.
22	SHERIFF	${\tt Mr.}$ Dollar, I'm a big enough man to admit it
23		when I've been wrong and I've been wrong
24		about you from the get-go.
25	JOHNNY	Sheriff?
26	SHERIFF	You have to understand - I never had any
27		reason to suspect Baldwin Jeffords. His
28		family has been important people in this
29		county since - well, since before it even
30		was a county.
31	JOHNNY	And that put him above suspicion.

1	SHERIFF	Well - yes. That and the fact that I've
2		known him my whole life. I'm still having
3		trouble with the notion that he could have
4		had anything to do with it but I'm willing
5		to take a closer look. But let me ask you
6		one thing.
7	JOHNNY	Shoot.
8	SHERIFF	If Baldwin is guilty, why in the world would
9		he ask me to re-open the investigations, ${\tt Mr.}$
10		Dollar?
11	JOHNNY	It might surprise you to know that I'm not
12		quite sure about Baldwin Jeffords myself.
13	SHERIFF	But who, then? And why?
14	JOHNNY	I don't know, Sheriff. But it doesn't seem
15		like Jeffords needed the insurance money and
16		if he just wanted out of his marriage
17		well divorce may be painful but it sure
18		beats the electric chair.
19	SHERIFF	Well, now I'm stuck with four open cases -
20		two of 'em stone cold. It's been nearly ten
21		years since Molly Jeffords died.
22	JOHNNY	Let's concentrate on the present. You may
23		never prove who killed the first Mrs.
24		Jeffords but odds are, if we can find Henry
25		Metcalfe's killer we'll have our man.
26	SHERIFF	We don't even know for sure yet that $\operatorname{Henry}'s$
27		death wasn't an accident.
28	JOHNNY	After what I've told you you don't really
29		believe it was?
30	SHERIFF	No, I don't suppose I do.
31	SFX	TELEPHONE RING PICKUP

1	SHERIFF	Sheriff Hardin Hello, Doc What? -
2		Blunt force trauma, you say? - Okay, thanks.
3	SFX	TELEPHONE HANGUP
4	SHERIFF	I've got to go, Mr. Dollar.
5	JOHNNY	The Jeffords estate?
6	SHERIFF	Yeah.
7	JOHNNY	Mind if I ride along?
8	SFX	FOOTSTEPS UNDER
9	SHERIFF	Sorry, this is official business.
10	SFX	DOOR OPEN _ SLAM SHUT
11	JOHNNY	The next time I saw the Sheriff he was
12		hauling Baldwin Jeffords out of the back of
13		his squad car - in handcuffs. Jeffords had
14		a bewildered, broken look about him as the
15		Sheriff hustled him into the county jail.
16	ETTA	Johnny, I can't begin to tell you how
17		grateful I am for what you've done. Without
18		you putting pressure on the Sheriff, Baldwin
19		Jeffords would have gotten away with killing
20		all three of his wives - and Henry Metcalfe
21		too.
22	JOHNNY	It's pretty remarkable. A few hours ago we
23		had nothing but suspicion and a dead man's
24		allegations. Now we have a victim, a murder
25		weapon and the killer all wrapped up in a
26		tidy package.
27	ETTA	You don't seem very happy.
28	JOHNNY	It's too neat. Metcalfe has a bump on his
29		head the size of a goose egg, no water in
30		his lungs and the murder weapon - a tire
31		iron from Baldwin Jeffords' own car - turns
32		up in the weeds fifteen feet away.

1	ETTA	Jeffords knew Metcalfe was about to spill
2		the beans. He killed him in a panic.
3	JOHNNY	Leaving the murder weapon at the scene?
4	ETTA	He put the body in the pond so it would look
5		like Metcalfe drowned, right? Who knows,
6		maybe he heard something and got scared.
7		So, he tossed the iron into the weeds
8		thinking he could come back for it later.
9	JOHNNY	It $\underline{\mathtt{is}}$ possible Metcalfe was attempting a
10		shake down. Jeffords probably wouldn't take
11		kindly to that.
12	ETTA	Doc says he was killed the night before. If
13		Jeffords threw that iron into the weeds at
14		night, he'd never find it again in the dark.
15		We're just lucky the body was found before
16		he had a chance to retrieve it the next
17		morning.
18	JOHNNY	I suppose. Still - I'd feel a whole lot
19		better if he confessed.
20	ETTA	Oh, come on, Johnny. The case is solved.
21		The killer is in jail. You've saved the
22		insurance company a lot of money. You
23		should relax a little and celebrate.
24	JOHNNY	(NARRATING) So we did. We celebrated well
25		into the night but my heart wasn't in it. I
26		still had misgivings I just couldn't shake.
27		Nevertheless, come the next morning I was
28		packing up to leave.
29		

1	SFX	TELEPHONE RING - PICKUP
2	JOHNNY	Johnny Dollar.
3	ETTA (FILTER)	Johnny, you're not going to believe this.
4	JOHNNY	Etta?
5	ETTA (FILTER)	I'm calling from the Sheriff's office. He
6		just released Baldwin Jeffords.
7	JOHNNY	Released? Why?
8	ETTA (FILTER)	The Sheriff sent that tire iron over to the
9		State Police lab for analysis. They found
10		fresh fingerprints on it.
11	JOHNNY	Well, that should clinch the case.
12	ETTA (FILTER)	They weren't Baldwin's fingerprints.

14	ETTA (FILTER)	They belonged to his mother. There's a
15		warrant out for her arrest.

19	JOHNNY	Can you hold on a second? There's somebody
20		at the door.
21	ETTA (FILTER)	I need to get back to the office, Johnny,
22		and write this up. You're not leaving, now?
23	JOHNNY	No, I suppose not.
24	ETTA (FILTER)	Good. I'll talk to you later, then.
25	SFX	DOOR KNOCK
26	JOHNNY	Alright. Goodbye.
27	SFX	TELEPHONE HANGUP - FOOTSTEPS - DOOR OPENS
28	JOHNNY	(SURPRISED) Mrs. Jeffords!
29	ANNABELLE	Step back, Mr. Dollar.
30	JOHNNY	If you shoot me with that you'll have a
31		rough time making it look like an accident.

1	ANNABELLE	You know, I could have. Before you came and
2		stirred things up, Sheriff Hardin could have
3		found me standing over your dead body with a
4		smoking gun in my hand and I still would
5		have convinced him you committed suicide.
6	JOHNNY	Suicide like your husband?
7	ANNABELLE	My husband? Why, how very clever of you,
